Due to Covid-19, the SPCA Cincinnati had to officially close its shelter doors to the public Monday, March 16th. After several weeks, this Monday, we were happy to say: #WelcomeBack! However, as you may know there are some policy changes.

Visit spcacincinnati.org for up-to-date information on available pets for adoption. If you are interested in adopting, follow these steps: Visit speacing nor up-to-date information on available pets for adoption. Complete an online application indicating the animal ID # of the pet of interested.




